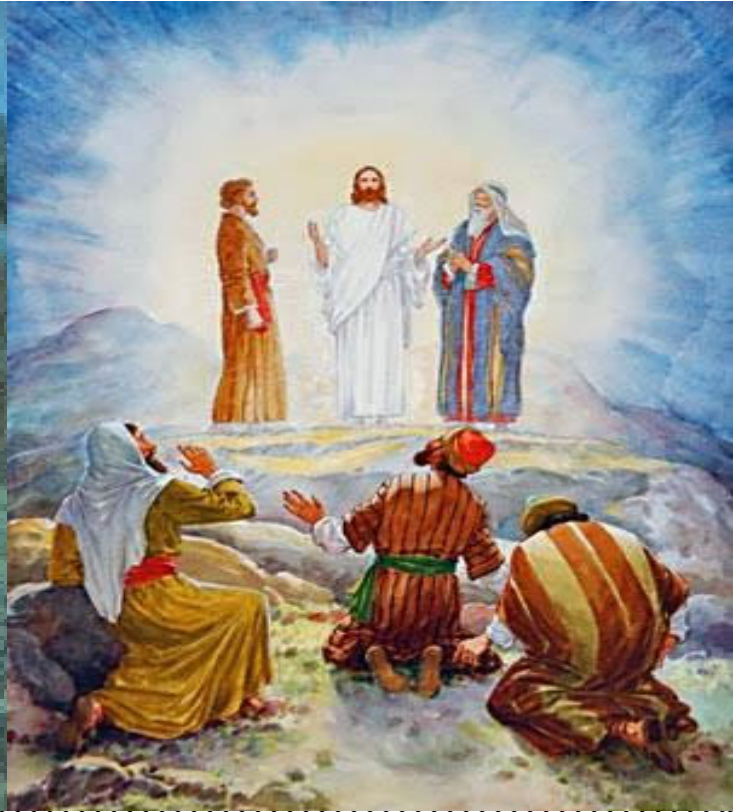

Our Transition to Transfiguration

Dear brothers and sisters,
 We are in our Lenten journey. We struggle in our world. God also struggled with rebellious, violent, and corrupt humanity as a whole (Eden, Cain and Abel, Noah and the flood, the tower of Babel.) As a result, God resolves to try a new strategy by

focusing on one particular family among all the families of the earth - old Abram and Sarai. God speaks a powerful and promising word into the barren family of Abraham.

God commands Abram to sever his ties to his larger nation, his ties to his larger kinship group, and finally, even his ties to his immediate family or father's house (12:1); but with a powerful promise. God said to "Go". Abraham "went".

First of all, God promises Abram a "land that I will show you." Secondly, to Abram's offspring a great nation with the implication of a long line of descendants. Thirdly, God promises to "bless" Abram. Blessing involves fertility, life, success, wellbeing, and a good name. He will be a blessing; his friends will be blessed, and his enemies will be cursed. Abraham and Sarah left behind an old life and look forward to a future not yet seen.

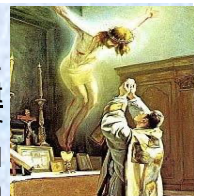
Jesus took Peter, James and John and transfigured himself showing them the new world for which they are called to live, a mountaintop experience - able to see our transformed world with Moses and Elijah - "it's good to be here." This happens when we leave our old and sinful life behind; we would see "Jesus alone".

The season of Lent is a season that helps us to let go of old commitments and burdens and sets us free to journey into new territories, new promises, new hopes, and new lives, thus to a new world; and to be a blessing.

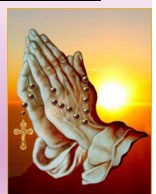

Fasting & Abstinence

- **Fasting** is defined as having one full meal a day, and is required only on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday. This requirement is for ages 18 to 59, but younger and older may participate.
- **During Lent** abstinence from meat on Friday's is obligatory in the United States, as elsewhere, for all Catholics age 14 until death. Getting caught up in the rubrical requirements, however, misses the point. Fasting is meaningless unless our hearts fast from obstacles blocking our way to true discipleship.

But while he thought on these things, behold the angel of the Lord appeared to him in his sleep, saying: Joseph, son of David, fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife, for that which is conceived in her, is of the Holy Spirit." – Matthew 1:20

March is the month that Mother Church dedicates to St. Joseph, the husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the earthly father of Jesus. St. Joseph is the model husband who listened to the will of God and devoted himself to care and provide for his wife and child. The Church recognizes St. Joseph twice in the Liturgical Year. He is honored once for being the spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary (March 19) and again, for being a good worker and provider for the Holy Family (May 1.) St. Joseph led his family on the straight and narrow path to the glory of God. Pope Pius IX proclaimed **Saint Joseph** the patron of the Universal Church in 1870. Having died in the "arms of Jesus and Mary" according to Catholic tradition, he is considered the model of the pious believer who receives grace at the moment of death, in other words, the patron of a happy death.

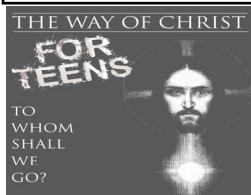

How Can the Parents Help Their Youth?

Good parents want their kids to stay out of trouble, do well in school, and go on to do awesome things as adults. And while there isn't a set recipe for raising successful children, psychologists have pointed to several factors that predict success. While it takes a range of practices and techniques to raise a child well-equipped for adulthood, some themes run throughout these tips: spending time with your child, letting your child make decisions, and maintaining a happy family.

Much of a child's development comes down to the parents - having both parents in the same household, in a loving relationship, leads to success in a child's adult life. The church youth ministry is always there to help the parents to help and grow their youth in a Godly and respectful way. We encourage you, parents, to bring your teens to our youth groups to grow to please God and you!



Lent in Our Youth Ministry: Live Respecting 40 Days

Before beginning his ministry, Jesus went into the desert to pray. He didn't eat or drink; he fasted and used the time to focus on his relationship with God. During the 40 days before Easter, known as Lent, we too are called to focus on our relationship with God. Catholics do three things to grow closer to God during Lent: pray, fast and give alms to those in need. Prayer, fasting and almsgiving are the three pillars of Lenten spirituality.

The first pillar of Lent is PRAYER.

We pray to grow in our relationship with God, and ask God for guidance on how to live our lives. In our prayer, we also thank God for the gifts we have been given, and we pray for those who have less than we do. During Lent, we can make an extra effort to pray each day to become the person God calls us to be.

The second pillar of Lent is FASTING.

Fasting means we give something up to make more space for what's truly important - our relationship with God and our neighbor. We do this to help us recognize the difference between wants and needs. Choosing to live without something we like reminds us that everything we have is a gift from God. Another aspect of Lenten fasting is not eating meat on Fridays.

The third pillar of Lent is ALMSGIVING. When we give to those who have less than we do, we honor Jesus' call to serve our neighbors, and we share the gifts we have received. This Lent, we will encounter people from other countries who we can help through our Lenten sacrifices to CRS Rice Bowl.

We reflect on our role to care for the most vulnerable - those experiencing hunger, lack of economic opportunity or violence that forces them to migrate. We have such a gift in the 40 days of Lent... all the way to Easter. We need to walk through the desert of Lent to meet our Lord there, beginning in the Liturgy and fully participating in the mystery of Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection. Whenever we respect the life of one another, beginning from our families, we are conscious of our dignity as humans and respect every human life.

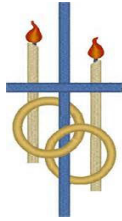
