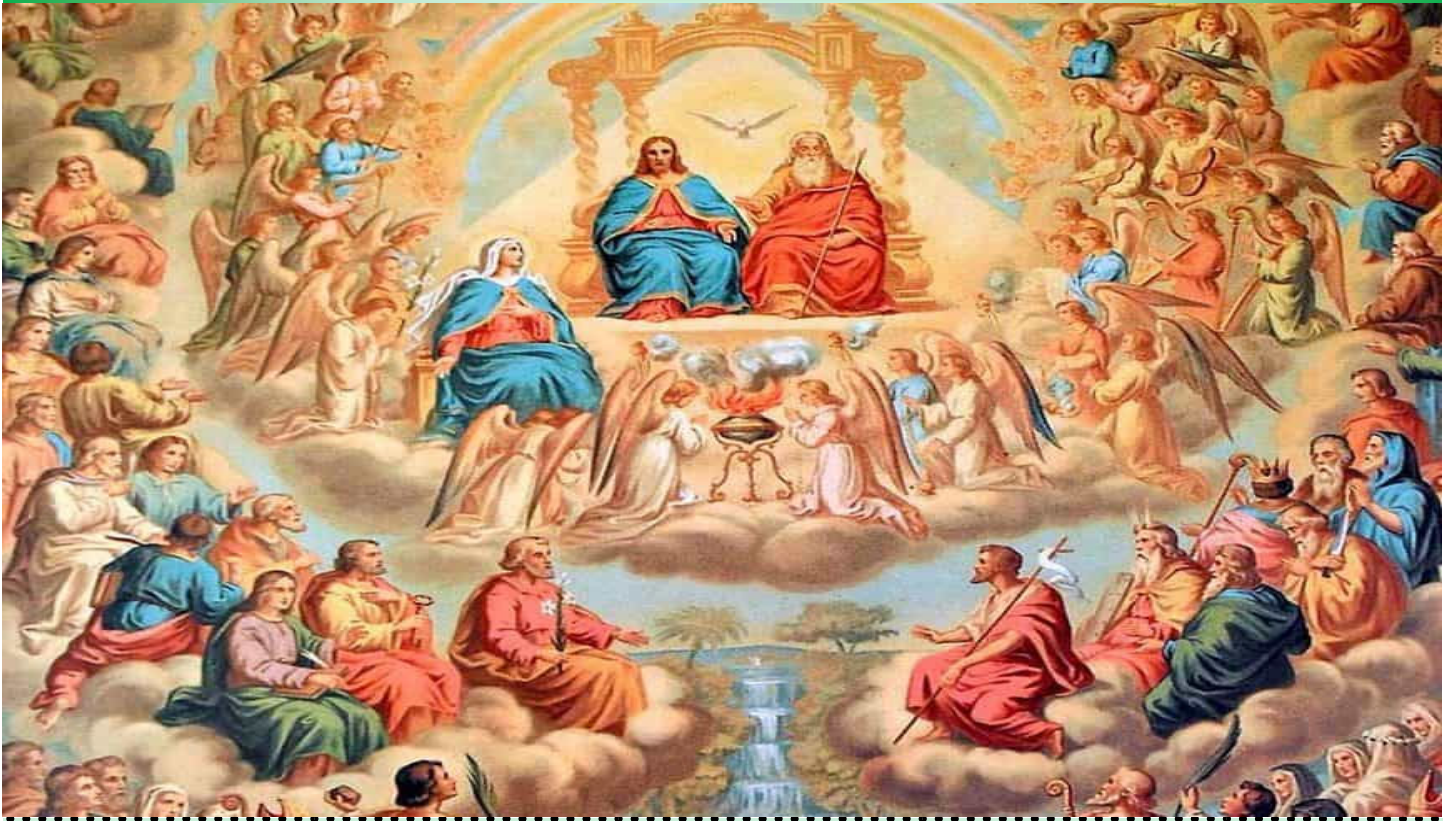

Pope's Intentions (November)

Communication and Reconciliation: That a spirit of dialogue, encounter and reconciliation emerges in the Near East, where diverse religious communities share their lives together.



Halloween: Holy Vigil of Saints

Dear brothers and sisters,
 Pope Francis said: "The saints are men and women who enter fully into the mystery of prayer; who struggle with prayer, letting the Holy Spirit pray and struggle in them to the very end, with all their strength; they triumph and the Lord triumphs in them and with them; they fought the good fight of faith and remained firm in faith, with a steadfast heart. Therefore, who is a saint? You and I are; the followers of Jesus. (Acts 9:13, 26:10, Rom. 8:27, and 1 Cor.1:2) Saints are those people of faith who actually become the very righteousness of God! (2 Cor. 5:21) Christ, the righteous, suffered for the sake of the unrighteous to lead us to God (1 Peter 3:18) and granted us sainthood! The saints are sinners who seek God's grace and salvation, ask forgiveness for their sins and are forgiven.

We celebrate "Halloween." Hallow means "holy" or "sacred." Therefore, "Hallows' Eve" or "Halloween" simply means "the evening of holy persons;" the evening before All Saints Day, Nov. 1st for all Christians. Halloween, the vigil celebration of All Saints Day, is a mixture of Celtic religious ideas and Christian martyrology.

From the 10th century, Nov. 2nd, has been celebrated as "All Souls' Day" to honor not just the martyrs, but all Christians who have died. People prayed for the dead, but many unchristian superstitions continued - on these two days, souls in purgatory would take the form of witches, toads, or demons and haunt persons who had wronged them during their lifetime. These are the superstitions, the pagan customs, the people absorbed today and lose the real significance.

Let us not lose our sainthood; but recourse to the saints to assist us with their prayers! May God also enable us to be men and women of prayer. Blessings! *Msrgr. Xavier*

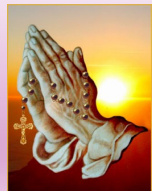

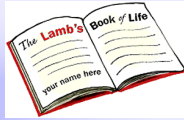

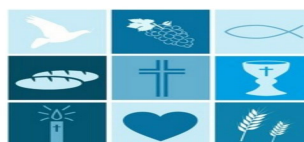

Why do we pray for the dead?



According to the Catholic Encyclopedia, the clearest Bible reference about prayers for the dead is from the Second Book of Maccabees. When soldiers were preparing the bodies of their slain comrades for burial they discovered

they were wearing amulets taken from a pagan temple which violated the law of Deuteronomy, so they prayed that God would forgive the sin these men had committed.

The New Testament echoes this notion in the second letter of Timothy when Paul prays for someone who died named Onesiphorus, saying: "May the Lord grant him to find mercy from the Lord on that day."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church also has something to say about prayers for the dead, stating: "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven" (1030).

May the souls of all the faithful departed Rest in Peace!
Pray for those who have no one to pray for them!
