Access Denied: How to Get in?

Dear brothers and sisters,

A bishop, after talking to his priest about the wise and foolish maidens, challenged them, "Young men, would you rather be in the light with the ten wise maidens or out in the dark with the ten foolish maidens?"

Well, the priests broke out in laughter and the bishop realized what he had said and joined them to the point that he couldn't finish his message. The bishop had a point. There are many who would choose the darkness over the light to satisfy their ideas!

The message of the parable is to be ready. The peoples complacency had begun to set in; just like some do during the COVID (no Mass, no prayers, no class, etc.) Hence the parable, served as a warning; and to remind us that our tardy and complacent attitude would be met by severe punishment. The point is not so much about being vigilant (remember all ten virgins felt drowsy and slept) but about being ready for the Lord's coming.

Perhaps you've heard the phrase, "Fill your bucket." Instead of lamps with oil, a bucket with spiritual fulfillment. The maidens with oil lamps were very wise and kept their bucket full. If they had shared their oil, all would have been in the dark. Keeping our spiritual bucket full and being ready for Christ to return is a beautiful idea, do we have to care for others? What if they care less?

Abraham Lincoln said "I have been driven many times to my knees by the overwhelming conviction that I had nowhere else to go. My own wisdom and that of those about me seemed insufficient for the day." Ask God for wisdom! [James 1:5] Socrates said, "You cannot learn Godly wisdom in a University and get a degree in it. It can only come to a heart in right relationship with God, and seeking it." The only true *wisdom* is in knowing you know nothing. Let us log-in with prayer, we would be able to access wisdom and entry in heaven!

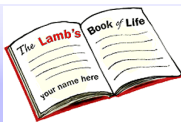

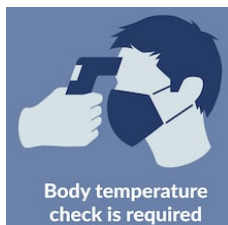
Three To Get Married

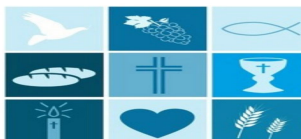

Why do we pray for the dead?



According to the Catholic Encyclopedia, the clearest Bible reference about prayers for the dead is from the Second Book of Maccabees. When soldiers were preparing the bodies of their slain comrades for burial they discovered

they were wearing amulets taken from a pagan temple which violated the law of Deuteronomy, so they prayed that God would forgive the sin these men had committed.

The New Testament echoes this notion in the second letter of Timothy when Paul prays for someone who died named Onesiphorus, saying: "May the Lord grant him to find mercy from the Lord on that day."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church also has something to say about prayers for the dead, stating: "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven" (1030).

May the souls of all the faithful departed Rest in Peace!
Pray for those who have no one to pray for them!

- Goal 3: To foster the total personal and spiritual growth of each young person.

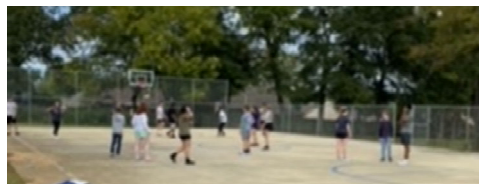

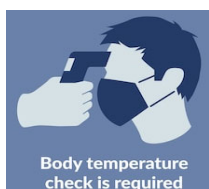

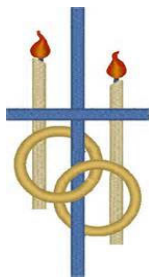
