Don't Bury Your Gifts

Dear brothers and sisters,

All of you would agree that we and our children are gifted. They are equipped to do many things and to make a difference in this world. The Bible says, "Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have; [Heb.13:6] "Do not withhold any goods from the owner when it is in your power to act. (Proverbs 3:27). That means, use what you have been given where it is most needed. Make a difference in this world because... "Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more." (Luke 12:48) Therefore, don't receive a gift or a blessing and sit down on it or bury it. When I say, "Don't 'bury' your gifts," there are consequences if you do. The "Parable of the Talents" explains it well. (Mt. 25:14-30)

"A mother and a baby camel were lying around under a tree. Then the baby camel asked several questions like our children do: 'Why do camels have humps?' 'Why are our legs long and our feet rounded?' and 'Why are our eye-lashes thick & long?' The mother camel answered everything with their purpose. The baby thought, and then he said, 'I see. So the hump is to store water when we are in the desert, the legs are for walking through the desert, and these eyelashes protect my eyes from the desert sand. He had one more question - 'then why are we in the zoo?'"



Skills and abilities are only useful if you are in the right place and they are used at the right time. Otherwise they go to waste. Therefore, if you have been gifted and want to grow your gifts, step out in faith, use your skills where they are needed, and make a unique difference in this world. Keep Christ in your life. "Be confident of this, that He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion... [Phil.1:6].

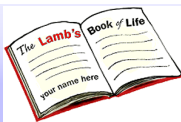

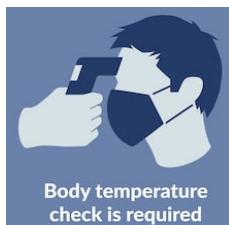

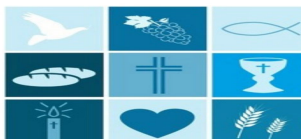

CATECHIST WANTED!

Why do we pray for the dead?



According to the Catholic Encyclopedia, the clearest Bible reference about prayers for the dead is from the Second Book of Maccabees. When soldiers were preparing the bodies of their slain comrades for burial they discovered

they were wearing amulets taken from a pagan temple which violated the law of Deuteronomy, so they prayed that God would forgive the sin these men had committed.

The New Testament echoes this notion in the second letter of Timothy when Paul prays for someone who died named Onesiphorus, saying: "May the Lord grant him to find mercy from the Lord on that day."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church also has something to say about prayers for the dead, stating: "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven" (1030).

May the souls of all the faithful departed Rest in Peace!

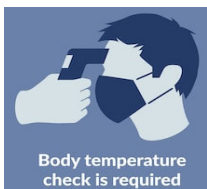

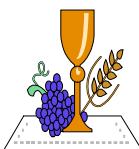

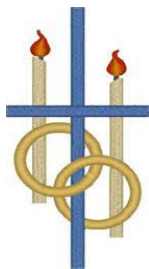
