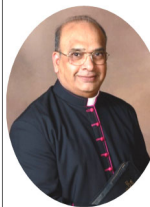

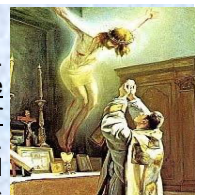

Child Abuse Prevention Month

Every April, child and youth serving organizations, including Catholic dioceses, parishes, and schools, participate in National Child Abuse Prevention Month to highlight the importance of protecting minors from abuse. These efforts are part of the ongoing work of the Church in the United States.



Learn the Signs of Child Abuse

- The child shows sudden changes in behavior or school performance.
- The child is always watchful as though preparing for something bad to happen.
- The child has not received help for medical problems brought to parents' attention.
- The child has learning problems that cannot be attributed to specific physical or psychological causes.
- The child is overly compliant, passive or withdrawn. The child lacks adult supervision.

EASTER SYMBOLS & TRADITIONS:

Easter Bunny:

According to some sources, the Easter bunny first arrived in America in the 1700s with German immigrants who settled in Pennsylvania and transported their tradition of an egg-laying hare called "Osterhase" or "Oschter Haws." Their children made nests in which this creature could lay its colored eggs. Eventually, the custom spread across the U.S. and the fabled rabbit's Easter morning deliveries expanded to include chocolate and other types of candy and gifts, while decorated baskets replaced nests.

Easter Egg:

The egg, an ancient symbol of new life, has been associated with pagan festivals celebrating spring. From a Christian perspective, Easter eggs are said to represent Jesus' emergence from the tomb and resurrection. Decorating eggs for Easter is a tradition that dates back to at least the 13th century, according to some sources. Easter egg hunts and egg rolling are two popular egg-related traditions. The event has no religious significance, although some people have considered egg rolling symbolic of the stone blocking Jesus' tomb being rolled away, leading to his resurrection.

Lamb and Traditional Easter Foods

Lamb is a traditional Easter food. Christians refer to Jesus as the "Lamb of God," though lamb at Easter also has roots in early Passover celebrations. In the story of Exodus, the people of Egypt suffered a series of terrible plagues, including the death of all firstborn sons. Members of the Jewish faith painted their doorposts with sacrificed lamb's blood so that God would "pass over" their homes. Jews who converted to Christianity continued the tradition of eating lamb at Easter. Historically, lamb would have been one of the first fresh meats available after a long winter with no livestock to slaughter.

Easter Lilies

White Easter Lilies symbolize the purity of Christ to Christians and are common decorations in churches and homes around the Easter holiday. Their growth from dormant bulbs in the ground to flowers symbolize the rebirth and hope of Christ's resurrection. They become the unofficial flower of Easter celebrations across the United States.

DURING LENT: How to start talking to God?

3. Silence

In a world with distractions and loud noises at every turn, it can be difficult to welcome silence. We view silence in conversations as awkward. Some people, can't go anywhere without headphones. We just don't like things being too quiet. Now we are busy with our phones.

But silence doesn't lie. When we enter into silence, when we can only hear the echo of our thoughts and fears, everything we try so hard to hide comes bubbling up to the surface. It's there in that space that we stare our flaws in the face, and it's there that those fears and the wounds can hurt the most. But it is also in that space where we can give those fears over to God, and allow Him to reign over them; there He can stretch out His sovereign hand and heal us.

4. Pray Through the Dry Spells

Prayer will not always feel fruitful or meaningful. Sometimes it's going to be dry; to feel like nothing is happening. But I assure you, prayer always works. It might not feel like it's working, but thankfully, our faith isn't based on feelings. Have faith that your prayers are reaching God, even if it doesn't feel like it. "God wants you to be the fullness of what you can be. You cannot become this if you do not allow Him to enter into you." If we don't give God the opportunity to enter into us and change us in prayer, our lives will remain the same.

He's ready to work in our lives, but He gave us free will to choose whether we allow Him to or not. It is our choice whether we receive or reject Him. Today, and every day after this, take some time to place yourself in the presence of God. Just sit, offering Him yourself and your time. Listen to what God is saying to your first, and then your response will come naturally.

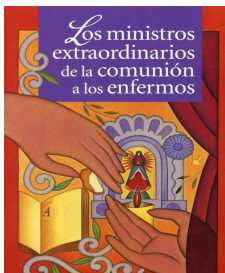

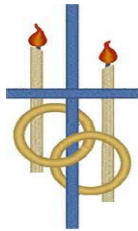
