15. Hope: A Light Through Darkness

Dear brothers and sisters,
Holy Week is a journey through darkness that ultimately leads to light. Hope, in the Christian life, is never cheap or easy. It is forged in the fire of suffering and tested through silence and waiting.

As the week unfolds, we witness Jesus washing feet, breaking bread, and praying in agony. We see betrayal, denial, and abandonment. Good Friday stands at the center of it all — a moment that seems anything but “good.” It is the day when hope appears lost, when the Savior is crucified and laid in a tomb. Yet it is precisely in that moment of apparent defeat that God is at work, planting the seeds of something greater.

Holy Saturday is the day of waiting — the silence between sorrow and joy. In many ways, we live much of our lives in “Holy Saturday,” in the tension between what has been promised and what is yet to come. It is a space where hope is quiet, persistent, and often unseen that leads to Easter morning. The stone is rolled away. The tomb is empty. Jesus is risen. In that moment, hope is not just restored — it is resurrected; God's light can pierce even the deepest darkness.

Through Holy Week and the resurrection, hope is redefined. It is not mere optimism or wishful thinking. It is the deep confidence that even when we cannot see it, God is present and at work. It is the assurance that suffering is not the end of the story - resurrection is. In the resurrection of Jesus, we find hope for our own lives: that broken things can be made whole, that mourning can turn to dancing, and that love will ultimately win.

May this Holy week bring you and your family the light that you need through the darkness of your life.

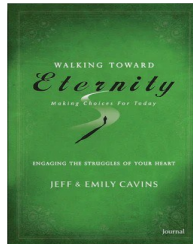

Dress Code: First Holy Communion & Confirmation

Girls: Dresses are NOT to be shorter than the knee or longer than the ankle. NO FORMALS. For those receiving First Holy Communion, the dress code is white; for the Confirmands, any color is permitted. Dress shoes or dress sandals (no tennis shoes). No dresses with spaghetti straps or without sleeves will be permitted. Without proper dress you may not be permitted to participate in the sacraments.

Boys: 1st Holy Communion: Dress shirt must be white, long or short sleeve. Dress pants may be white, navy blue or black. Ties - white, navy blue or black;

Boys: Confirmation: Dress shirt of any solid color. Dark dress pants - navy blue or black; (no tennis shoes); Suit coats or jackets are optional (not a requirement).



A Test of Faith

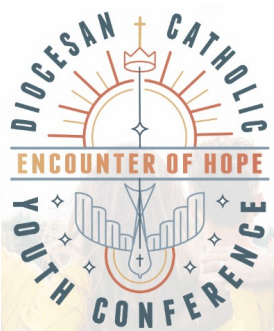

Holy Week and Easter



What is the Triduum?

The word "Triduum" means "three days." In the Church we have a three day commemoration of Jesus' Passion, death and Resurrection. We call this commemoration the

Triduum. The Triduum starts with Mass on the Thursday before Easter (Holy Thursday) continuing all day Friday (Good Friday) and Saturday (Holy Saturday) and culminates with the Easter Vigil celebration.

On Holy Thursday we celebrate three great events in our Church - Passover, the institution of the Eucharist and the institution of the Priesthood. At the Last Supper Jesus gave the bread and wine to His apostles, not as a symbol or sign of love, but as His actual body and blood. We celebrate this moment as the institution of the Eucharist. In this same moment, Jesus charged His apostles to, "Do this in remembrance of me."

(1 Cor.11:24). He instructed His apostles to continue what He did by celebrating and remembering Him in this specific way. He gave them the authority to make bread and wine into His body and blood. This is the institution of the priesthood.

If you would like to continue the mission of Christ as a priest, please talk to your pastor or any priest you know. Blessings!

15. Esperanza de luz en medio de la oscuridad

Queridos hermanos y hermanas,

La Semana Santa es un viaje a través de la oscuridad que finalmente conduce a la luz. La esperanza, en la vida cristiana, nunca es barata ni fácil. Se forja en el fuego del sufrimiento y se prueba mediante el silencio y la espera. A medida que transcurre la semana, presenciamos a Jesús lavando los pies, partiendo el pan y orando en agonía. Vemos traición, negación y abandono. El Viernes Santo se sitúa en el centro de todo, un momento que parece todo menos "bueno". Es el día en que la esperanza parece perdida, cuando el Salvador es crucificado y puesto en un sepulcro. Sin embargo, es precisamente en ese momento de aparente derrota que Dios obra, sembrando las semillas de algo mayor.

El Sábado Santo es el día de la espera: el silencio entre la tristeza y la alegría. En muchos sentidos, vivimos gran parte de nuestras vidas en el "Sábado Santo", en la tensión entre lo prometido y lo que está por venir. Es un espacio donde la esperanza es serena, persistente y, a menudo, invisible, que nos lleva a la mañana de Pascua. La piedra es removida. La tumba está vacía. Jesús ha resucitado. En ese momento, la esperanza no solo se restaura, sino que resucita; la luz de Dios puede penetrar incluso la oscuridad más profunda.

A través de la Semana Santa y la resurrección, la esperanza se redefine. No es mero optimismo ni ilusiones. Es la profunda confianza de que, incluso cuando no podemos verlo, Dios está presente y obrando. Es la certeza de que el sufrimiento no es el final de la historia; la resurrección sí lo es. En la resurrección de Jesús, encontramos esperanza para nuestras propias vidas: que las cosas rotas pueden sanar, que el duelo puede convertirse en alegría y que el amor finalmente triunfará.

Que esta Semana Santa les traiga a ustedes y a su familia la luz que necesitan en medio de la oscuridad de su vida. Oraciones y bendiciones! -Mons. Xavier

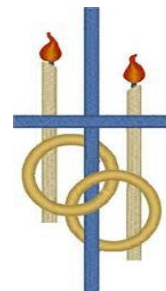
